Pesach is a festival of celebration. We welcome visitors, attend Seders and go to Synagogue.

It is also an excellent time to have conversations about child safety with our children and young adults

Rules for body safety:

- Your body belongs to you.
- No one has the right to touch you.
- If someone breaks the touching rule, Say NO, Get away, and tell an adult.

Children should be in the care of a designated adult at all times.

Check in with your children to make sure that they are OK.

Agree on a signal (or code word) with your children if they feel unsafe

If your child feels unsafe, encourage them to speak to you
